

**IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO PLAN
YOUR SUMMER *VO* CATION!**

How is God calling you to grow spiritually this summer?
Here are some suggestions. Try one or more (that you aren't already doing).

- Fast one step more strictly than the last Apostles' Fast: Skip desserts; or skip meat on Wednesdays & Fridays or for the whole Fast; wait on your favorite TV or Netflix shows or secular music until the Fast is over.
- Trade in Web surfing for reading a chapter from the Gospels a day.
- Reclaim the first five minutes of each day to say Morning Prayers if you have drifted away from that practice.
 - Most particularly, ask God, in the morning, to help you in any situations (tests ... tryouts ... meetings ... medical appointments) which you are anxious about that are coming up that day.
- Before you go to sleep, "rewind" over the day and ask God's forgiveness of any sins you can remember from the day that has passed.
- If you're married, ask your spouse's forgiveness before you go to sleep.
- On a fast day (Wednesday or Friday) or during a fasting period, read a book like...
 - *Everyday Saints*;
 - *Born to Hate, Reborn to Love*; or
 - *The Gurus, The Young Man, and Elder Paisios*.
- Before sending a text message, ask, "Lord, is this okay?"
- When you DO go away on vacation, while you're making your reservations, find the church you'll go to on Sunday: Go to www.orthodoxyinamerica.org and use their "Search" tool. Call the church to verify the service times, and tell the priest you'd like his blessing to come to Holy Communion if that is your intention.

A DEFINITION OF CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

How might we describe "stewardship in action?"

1. Stewardship is our active commitment to use all our time, talent and treasure for the benefit of humankind in grateful acknowledgment of Christ's redeeming love.
2. Stewardship is caring for the needs of others.
3. Stewardship is offering one's self to God as He offered Himself to us.
4. Stewardship is what you do after saying "I Believe . . .", as proof of that belief.
5. Stewardship is learning how to be a responsible and concerned caretaker of Christ's Church; it is learning how to enjoy Church life and be happy in Church work, for in the Church dwells the fullness of the Spirit of God.
6. Stewardship is devotion and service to God and His Church as persons, as families, as deaneries, as diocese, as national Church, and as the Church universal.

Stewardship is *not* only to do with money, though money is an integral part of it. Education for the whole parish on Stewardship as a Christian Commitment will be made available in the coming months. Meanwhile, consider these few points as they relate to your own ability and desire to give God back a portion of what He has given you.

TODAY’S EPISTLE Hebrews 11:33-12:2 Brethren: the time would fail me to tell of Gideon and Barak and Samson and Jephthah, also of David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. Women received their dead raised to life again. Others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented – of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

TODAY’S GOSPEL Matthew 10:32-33, 37-38, 19:27-30 Our Lord said, “Therefore whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, him I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven. He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. Then Peter answered and said to Him, “See, we have left all and followed You. Therefore what shall we have?” So Jesus said to them, “Assuredly I say to you, that in the regeneration, when the Son of Man sits on the throne of His glory, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name’s sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first.”
