PASTORAL CARE – GENERAL INFORMATION

Emergency Sick Calls can be made at any time. Please call Fr. David at (914) 965-6815, when a family member is admitted to the hospital.

Anointing In Sickness: The Sacrament of Unction is available in Church, the hospital, or your home, for anyone who is sick, however severe. It doesn't mean “Last Rites!”

Marriages and Baptisms require early planning, scheduling, and selection of sponsors (crown bearers or godparents). See Father before booking dates and reception halls!

Funerals are celebrated for practicing Orthodox Christians. Please see Father for details.

The Church opposes cremation; we cannot celebrate funerals for cremations.

TODAY'S EPISTLE Acts 20:16-18, 28-36 In those days, Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus, so that he would not have to spend time in Asia; for he was hurrying to be at Jerusalem, if possible, on the Day of Pentecost.¹⁷From Miletus he sent to Ephesus and called for the elders of the church.¹⁸And when they had come to him, he said to them: “You know, from the first day that I came to Asia, in what manner I always lived among you,²⁸Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood.²⁹For I know this, that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock.³⁰Also from among yourselves men will rise up, speaking perverse things, to draw away the disciples after themselves.³¹Therefore watch, and remember that for three years I did not cease to warn everyone night and day with tears.³²So now, brethren, I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.³³I have coveted no one's silver or gold or apparel.³⁴Yes, you yourselves know that these hands have provided for my necessities, and for those who were with me.³⁵I have shown you in every way, by laboring like this, that you must support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, ‘It is more blessed to give than to receive.’³⁶And when he had said these things, he knelt down and prayed with them all.

TODAY'S GOSPEL John 17:1-13 Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: “Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You,²as You have given Him authority over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as You have given Him.³And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.⁴I have glorified You on the earth. I have finished the work which You have given Me to do.⁵And now, O Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was.⁶I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word.⁷Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You.⁸For I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me.⁹I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours.¹⁰And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them.¹¹Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as We are.¹²While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled.¹³But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves.”
