The Church opposes cremation; we cannot celebrate funerals for cremations.



TODAY’S EPISTLE 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 Brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand,²by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you – unless you believed in vain.³For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures,⁴and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures,⁵and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve.⁶After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep.⁷After that He was seen by James, then by all the apostles.⁸Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time.⁹For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.¹⁰But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me.¹¹Therefore, whether it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

TODAY’S GOSPEL Matthew 19:16-26 At that time, one came and said to Him, “Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?”¹⁷So He said to him, “Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God. But if you want to enter into life, keep the commandments.”¹⁸He said to Him, “Which ones?” Jesus said, “‘You shall not murder,’ ‘You shall not commit adultery,’ ‘You shall not steal,’ ‘You shall not bear false witness,’¹⁹Honor your father and your mother,’ and, ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ “²⁰The young man said to Him, “All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?”²¹Jesus said to him, “If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me.”²²But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions.²³Then Jesus said to His disciples, “Assuredly, I say to you that it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven.²⁴And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.²⁵When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, “Who then can be saved?”²⁶But Jesus looked at them and said to them, “With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.”
