

Patron feast days

Catechumens have learned to observe their patron feast day by attending Divine Liturgy (if it is served), to pray to their patron saint, and to greet others who celebrate their feast day with "Many years!" There is more: the Church provides a special blessing for a *kolyva* on a saint's day. We often think of kolyva —



the sweetened boiled wheat — as something offered in honor of the departed, but there is also a "kolyva for the saint". This kolyva can be the sweetened boiled grain, or it can be a bread, even fruit or pastries. It is brought to church and placed on a small table and then at the "Blessed be the name of the Lord" at the end of the Divine Liturgy, the choir sings the troparion to the saint, the priest comes with censer and holy water and reads the specific prayer for the blessing of this kolyva in honor of the saint. After the dismissal of the Liturgy, the person who has offered the kolyva distributes it to the people present in honor of his feast day.

It is also customary to make an offering either to the church, to a monastery, or to the poor on one's feast day, in honor of the saint, for the saints were not only offerings to God, but also teach us to show mercy and give alms.

Fr. David notes: Anybody wants to bring a kolyva for their or a loved one's Name's Day, let me know!

Marriages and Baptisms require early planning, scheduling, and selection of sponsors (crown bearers or godparents). See Father before booking dates and reception halls! Funerals are celebrated for practicing Orthodox Christians. Please see Father for details. The Church opposes cremation; we cannot celebrate funerals for cremations.

Come to the wedding.' 5But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm, another to his business.6And the rest seized his servants, treated them spitefully, and killed them.7But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city.8Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy.9'Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.'10So those servants went out into the highways and gathered together all whom they found, both bad and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests.11But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment.12So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless.13Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'14For many are called, but few are chosen."
