The Annual Diocesan Altar Servers retreat is scheduled for **February 12-14, 2016 at Saint Basil's Academy, 79 St. Basil's Road, Garrison NY**. Saint Basil's Academy has beautiful grounds offering dormitory style rooms, an indoor basketball court and an Olympic-size indoor swimming pool which will be available for use.

Saint Basil's Academy dormitory space has been reserved for the Diocese of New York and New Jersey. The arrival of the altar servers will be on Friday evening, February 12. The retreat will conclude on Sunday, February 14, following the celebration of the Divine Liturgy.



TODAY'S EPISTLE Acts 6:8-15; 7:1-5, 47-60 In those days, Stephen, full of faith and power, did great wonders and signs among the people.⁹Then there arose some from what is called the Synagogue of the Freedmen (Cyrenians, Alexandrians, and those from Cilicia and Asia), disputing with Stephen.¹⁰And they were not able to resist the wisdom and the Spirit by which he spoke.¹¹Then they secretly induced men to say, "We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God."¹²And they stirred up the people, the elders, and the scribes; and they came upon him, seized him, and brought him to the council.¹³They also set up false witnesses who said, "This man does not cease to speak blasphemous words against this holy place and the law;¹⁴for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and change the customs which Moses delivered to us.¹⁵And all who sat in the council, looking steadfastly at him, saw his face as the face of an angel.¹Then the high priest said, "Are these things so?"²And he said, "Brethren and fathers, listen: The God of glory appeared to our father Abraham when he was in Mesopotamia, before he dwelt in Haran,³and said to him, 'Get out of your country and from your relatives, and come to a land that I will show you.'⁴Then he came out of the land of the Chaldeans and dwelt in Haran. And from there, when his father was dead, He moved him to this land in which you now dwell.⁵And God gave him no inheritance in it, not even enough to set his foot on. But even when Abraham had no child, He promised to give it to him for a possession, and to his descendants after him.⁶But Solomon built Him a house.⁷However, the Most High does not dwell in temples made with hands, as the prophet says:⁸Heaven is My throne, And earth is My footstool. What house will you build for Me? says the LORD, Or what is the place of My rest?⁹Has My hand not made all these things?¹⁰You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers did, so do you.¹¹Which of the prophets did your fathers not persecute? And they killed those who foretold the coming of the Just One, of whom you now have become the betrayers and murderers,¹²who have received the law by the direction of angels and have not kept it."¹³When they heard these things they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed at him with their teeth.¹⁴But he, being full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God,¹⁵and said, "Look! I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!"¹⁶Then they cried out with a loud voice, stopped their ears, and ran at him with one accord;¹⁷and they cast him out of the city and stoned him. And the witnesses laid down their clothes at the feet of a young man named Saul.¹⁸And they stoned Stephen as he was calling on God and saying, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit."¹⁹Then he knelt down and cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not charge them with this sin." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

TODAY'S GOSPEL Matthew 2:13-23 At that time, when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, "Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I bring you word; for Herod will seek the young Child to destroy Him."14When he arose, he took the young Child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt,15and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, "Out of Egypt I called My Son."16Then Herod, when he saw that he was deceived by the wise men, was exceedingly angry; and he sent forth and put to death all the male children who were in Bethlehem and in all its districts, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had17Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:18A voice was heard in Ramah, Lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, Refusing to be comforted, Because they are no more."19Now when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt,20saying, "Arise, take the young Child and His mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the young Child's life are dead."21Then he arose, took the young Child and His mother, and came into the land of Israel.22But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning over Judea instead of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And being warned by God in a dream, he turned aside into the region of Galilee.23And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, "He shall be called a Nazarene."
