Stewardship at Holy Trinity Orthodox Church

This year we are blessed to have the opportunity to think in depth about stewardship, our humble response to God's great love for us.

Stewardship is not just about money. It is about taking care of the magnificent blessings God has given us – number one being His Holy House; His Church. Stewardship is about leading our lives in such a way that we are constantly expressing our gratitude to God for all the amazing ways He has blessed our lives. Stewardship, done well, lets us express that our entire life is God's gift. In our heart of hearts, we know: **We really own nothing; everything is on loan to us from God.** When we are loaned something of value, don't we try to take care of it in order to return it back to its rightful owner in at least as good condition as it was given to us?

Throughout the Scriptures, God is extravagant in His grace and goodness to the grateful and the ungrateful alike – to those striving for sainthood, and even to "those who are hardened in sin". He is never miserly! Over and over again, the Scriptures teach us to always be generous toward the Lord and other people. Nowhere in the Scriptures are we instructed to wait until we have everything we want before we are generous to others. No one ever became a saint because of how **little** he or she did on behalf of Christ and His Church.

So if stewardship is a reflection not only of this Christian attitude, but also of our faith in and gratitude to the God Whom we say we love and serve, how then can we not RUN towards this opportunity to return, as best we can, all God's generosity and love to us? Let us seize the moment and grow in thankfulness to God as we pledge our "thanks" through our giving to Holy Trinity Church.

TODAY'S EPISTLE **Corinthians 6:16-7:1** Brethren: What agreement has the temple of God with idols? For you are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will dwell in them And walk among them. I will be their God, And they shall be My people."¹⁷Therefore Come out from among them And be separate, says the Lord. Do not touch what is unclean, And I will receive you."¹⁸I will be a Father to you, And you shall be My sons and daughters, Says the LORD Almighty."¹⁹Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.

TODAY'S GOSPEL **Luke 8:5-15** The Lord told this parable: "A sower went out to sow his seed. And as he sowed, some fell by the wayside; and it was trampled down, and the birds of the air devoured it.⁶Some fell on rock; and as soon as it sprang up, it withered away because it lacked moisture.⁷And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up with it and choked it.⁸But others fell on good ground, sprang up, and yielded a crop a hundredfold. When He had said these things He cried, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!"⁹Then His disciples asked Him, saying, "What does this parable mean?"¹⁰And He said, "To you it has been given to know the mysteries of the kingdom of God, but to the rest it is given in parables, that 'Seeing they may not see, And hearing they may not understand.'¹¹Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God.¹²Those by the wayside are the ones who hear; then the devil comes and takes away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved.¹³But the ones on the rock are those who, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, who believe for a while and in time of temptation fall away.¹⁴Now the ones that fell among thorns are those who, when they have heard, go out and are choked with cares, riches, and pleasures of life, and bring no fruit to maturity.¹⁵But the ones that fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience."
