

IT'S TIME TO PREPARE THE "ED BUILDING" FOR A RENTER!
(We'll still have it for Coffee Hour.)

Our Parish Council is in the process of negotiating a lease to rent out the Education Building. The possible tenant is a local not-for-profit agency that supports and educates children who are transitioning out of disadvantaged circumstances. So far, the negotiations are moving very positively. This rental would greatly help the parish financially -- and it would greatly bless us in many other ways too, since the Education Building would be put to use, every day, for education!

The lease clearly states that the parish will have access to the Education Building restrooms and upper floor (the kitchen and the gym) on Sundays, until the end of Coffee Hour. Also, we do not need to remove the tables, chairs, and other furniture -- the tenant would use those things for their classes and programs. The Ladies Guild Gift Shop would remain in its current spot and be open on Sundays. Our Church School and other parish needs, including facilities for non-Sunday services, will be accommodated in other ways. The Council is working on those arrangements now.

We all need to come together and work as a family to prepare our "house" for this blessing. Below is a schedule of upcoming Sundays, most including packing sessions. 

Anointing In Sickness: The Sacrament of Unction is available in Church, the hospital, or your home, for anyone who is sick, however severe. **It doesn't mean “Last Rites!”**

Marriages and Baptisms require early planning, scheduling, and selection of sponsors (crown bearers or godparents). **See Father before booking dates and reception halls!**

Funerals are celebrated for practicing Orthodox Christians. Please see Father for details.

The Church opposes cremation; we cannot celebrate funerals for cremations.

TODAY'S EPISTLE 1 Timothy 1:15-17 My son Timothy, this is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief.¹⁶However, for this reason I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might show all longsuffering, as a pattern to those who are going to believe on Him for everlasting life.¹⁷Now to the King eternal, immortal, invisible, to God who alone is wise, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

GOSPEL: LUKE 18:35-43 At that time, as Jesus was coming near Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the road begging.³⁶And hearing a multitude passing by, he asked what it meant.³⁷So they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by.³⁸And he cried out, saying, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!”³⁹Then those who went before warned him that he should be quiet; but he cried out all the more, “Son of David, have mercy on me!”⁴⁰So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be brought to Him. And when he had come near, He asked him,⁴¹saying, “What do you want Me to do for you?” He said, “Lord, that I may receive my sight.”⁴²Then Jesus said to him, “Receive your sight; your faith has made you well.”⁴³And immediately he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.
