TODAY'S EPISTLE 2 Corinthians 1:21-2:4 Brethren: Now He who establishes us with you in Christ and has anointed us is God, who also has sealed us and given us the Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee. Moreover I call God as witness against my soul, that to spare you I came no more to Corinth. Not that we have dominion over your faith, but are fellow workers for your joy; for by faith you stand. But I determined this within myself, that I would not come again to you in sorrow. For if I make you sorrowful, then who is he who makes me glad but the one who is made sorrowful by me? And I wrote this very thing to you, lest, when I came, I should have sorrow over those from whom I ought to have joy, having confidence in you all that my joy is the joy of you all. For out of much affliction and anguish of heart I wrote to you, with many tears, not that you should be grieved, but that you might know the love which I have so abundantly for you.

TODAY'S GOSPEL Luke 5:1-11 At that time, as the multitude pressed about Him to hear the word of God, that He stood by the Lake of Gennesaret, and saw two boats standing by the lake; but the fishermen had gone from them and were washing their nets. Then He got into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. And He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. When He had stopped speaking, He said to Simon, "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." But Simon answered and said to Him, "Master, we have toiled all night and caught nothing; nevertheless at Your word I will let down the net." And when they had done this, they caught a great number of fish, and their net was breaking. So they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. When Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!" For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which they had taken; and so also were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men." So when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him.

GETTING SERIOUS ABOUT OUR CHURCH RENOVATIONS: WE NEED BATHROOMS ... WE NEED A KITCHEN ... WE NEED YOU!

EXCITEMENT was in the air this past Sunday -- at the Parish Meeting held during Coffee Hour, where **\$30,000 was pledged within ten minutes** (and some of it already paid), to kick off the funding of "Phase One" of the Fellowship Hall Renovations!

The parish voted overwhelmingly to take a bold and faithful step toward realizing the long-awaited vision of installing restrooms, making the space and water connections for a kitchen, and creating a meeting room and a classroom in the downstairs Fellowship Hall. We will pursue a loan from a Church-based lending company to accomplish the renovation, and we have committed to a Capital Campaign to raise, within 5 years, the \$200,000 estimated to pay off the loan.

Inspired by the Parish Council's presentation of this plan for doing and funding the renovations, 9 parishioners stood and spontaneously pledged a total of \$25,000 (and some handed in their gifts on the spot) to kick-start the fundraising. Other parishioners unable to attend had submitted pledges in advance of the meeting. His Eminence, Archbishop Michael, sent his greetings and encouragement on the beginning of "Phase One" and put forth a most generous financial pledge, which -- as with each donor who announced their support -- was met with grateful applause by the parish assembly.

As you know, we have also been envisioning putting in an ADA-accessible wheel chair lift, and landscaping the walkway from Seymour Street to the rectory side of the church, so that anyone not able to climb the steps can get into either floor of the church. This remains our ultimate vision -- we are calling it "Phase Two". We are looking into opportunities to apply for outside grant assistance for Phase Two.

Meanwhile we need bathrooms ... we need meeting rooms ... we need to start building in a kitchen ... and we need (by law) a second exit so that we may use the hall to its fullest. So, Phase One is the goal, for now. We estimate Phase One will cost \$200,000.

So -- by now, you are asking: **How can I join in this excitement?**

One way, of course, is to come to church on a Sunday, or a holy day, and worship here...
another way is to come to Coffee Hour and experience the joy of breaking bread and chatting with brothers and sisters in Christ...
still another way is to offer a pledge to the Capital Campaign.

HOW CAN I PLEDGE MY FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO THE RENOVATIONS?

Approximately 100 households (a single person or a family)
are either parish members or friends of the parish.

Our goal is to raise \$200,000 within 5 years.

On average, \$200,000 divided by 100 families is \$2,000 per family, **in addition to regular annual stewardship pledges to operate the parish.** This could be spread out, for example:

- **OVER 3 YEARS:** \$2,000 over 3 years = \$667 per year ... \$55.58 per month ... \$12.83 per week
- **OVER 5 YEARS:** \$2,000 over 5 years = \$400 per year ... \$33.33 per month ... \$7.70 per week

Some people have been blessed with more materially so can give more than the average.

Some people can give something, even if it is less than the average.

What can you give, as an offering of thanks for all that God has blessed you with?

Won't you join in the excitement -- the ownership -- and the commitment of making real the dream of making our Church building a single ministry center, complete with all the facilities we need to provide beautiful space and warm hospitality to our members and our visitors?

Please prayerfully consider what you can give -- over the next 3 to 5 years, or now if you wish. One of our Capital Campaign Team members will contact you soon to invite you to be a part of this next chapter in the life of Holy Trinity Church!
